The Core Curriculum

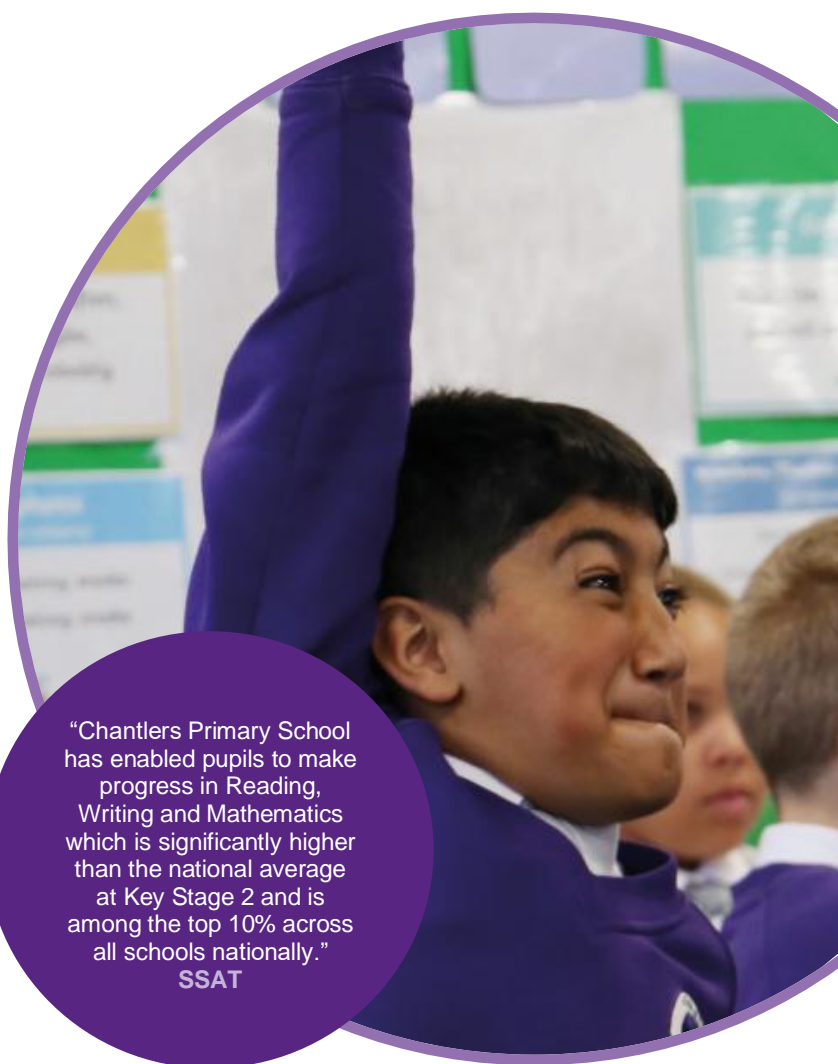

The Curriculum

Values and Ethos

We believe that our school aims and values ensure our children develop their full potential in all aspects of their learning and personal development. We have a relentless drive for excellence and to provide all children with 'A World of Possibilities'. Our aim is that all children are safe, demonstrate our core values, have excellent social and emotional skills and fulfil their potential. Our curriculum ensures that children are well prepared for their next stage of education, are resilient and capable of independent thought, leaving us knowing there is a world of possibilities ahead.



Our Curriculum Approach

Our curriculum is designed with inspirational individuals and values at the core of all we do. Analysis of our pupils' backgrounds, life experiences and culture has helped us to design a curriculum underpinned by inspirational people and six key values:

- **Integrity**

Our learning approach, our learning environment and our curriculum are organised with the children at the centre, so their experience at Chantlers is of a rich, rewarding education where all children achieve and succeed, no matter of their starting point. Our aim is for all children to leave Chantlers, equipped with a toolbox of skills and attributes, used to enable success in their next stages of education.



Our Organisation

Chantlers is a highly organized school, offering a carefully structured, broad and balanced curriculum. We keep an appropriate focus on the core subjects of English, Maths and Science, whilst also ensuring that all children benefit from a rich and diverse range of topics, delivered through a tailored curriculum. Through this, we extend children's learning far beyond the requirements of the National Curriculum. We have varied schemes, modified by teachers, each offering vibrant, progressive and ambitious curriculums for subjects such as DT, French and Art.

Our curriculum also offers wider learning experiences, enabling our most vulnerable children to thrive, aided by pupil leadership opportunities and the use of our own Forest School and Mental Health and Wellbeing Hub.



Curriculum Design

Our curriculum is clearly structured to ensure every child is developing their core skills, experiencing a broad and rich curriculum and do so alongside building excellent personal, social and emotional skills. Our children strive to reach their potential, aspire for greater depth and mastery, and are fearless in what they can achieve. We tailor our curriculum to ensure that children are not merely covering content, but are also achieving depth to their learning, which enables them to transfer their skills and understanding to all areas of the curriculum and beyond. One of our children summed up this attitude, which shines out throughout our school:

The curriculum also reflects the school's location (as an urban Greater Manchester school) and the local community, as well as the interests and passions of the staff and children.

Early Years

At Chantlers Primary School, language is the foundation of children's thinking and learning.

Our EYFS curriculum places a strong focus on communication skills and pupils' acquisition of basic skills in reading, writing and maths whilst developing the whole child.



The Curriculum

Our Early Years curriculum is based around our school vision, school book and school values. This is organised half termly and is based in the first instance around the Seasons and annual celebrations. This is underpinned by the skills we teach in our Forest School and is driven also by the children's interests.

In the early Autumn Term this allows for the development of the Prime areas including Gross/Fine motor skills. It also allows for rich language and communication opportunities and assists our children to develop socially and emotionally with their peers within their new setting. We also invest time into establishing the Characteristics of Effective Learning through characters, stories and challenges within continuous provision.



Home Reading

At Chantlers, we ensure that reading is not only enjoyed and developed at school, but also in each child's home environment. We provide children with books that are wellmatched to their phonetical learning sequence. This will ensure that children have the best chances to develop into confident readers at home as well as in school.

Reading Culture

We emerge pupils from day one into a reading culture. Our staff read regularly to our children and our curriculum is based around one core text per half term.

We ensure that the themes from books are supported in our learning environment and that pupils have the opportunities to explore characters and settings through a range of activities to nurture a love of reading.

Phonics

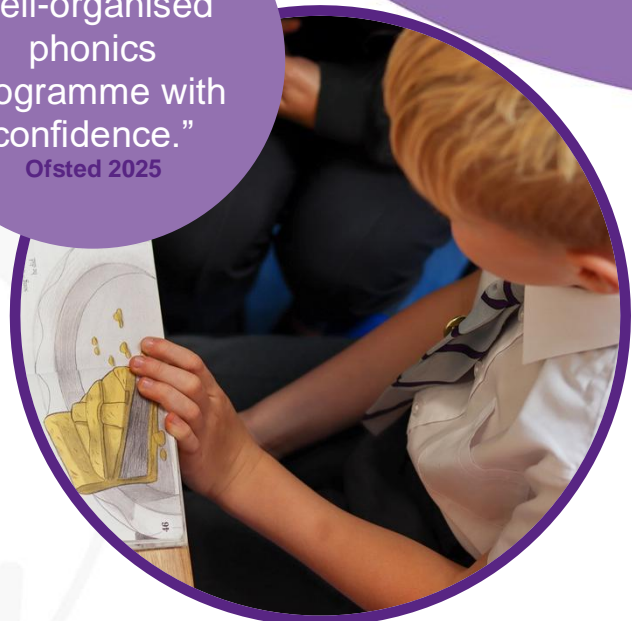
Reading has the highest priority at our school as it enables children to access the full curriculum. We believe that all children can become fluent readers and writers. We start teaching phonics in Pre-School/Reception where they access a programme of systematic and synthetic phonics programme – Little Wandle, delivered by highly trained staff. Excellent teaching of reading throughout school ensures high attainment.

Wellbeing & Pastoral Excellence



Pastoral Manager

Chantlers Primary School is fully committed to the protection and nurturing of all our pupils and in creating an inclusive, safe and secure environment in which they can develop into responsible, confident, self-aware, capable young people who are well equipped to cope with the challenges ahead of them.

The Pastoral Manager provides pastoral support and guidance to all our children, promoting their wellbeing by liaising with parents/guardians, school staff, and external agencies. Children are encouraged to approach any staff at any time if they feel in need of her support. The Pastoral Manager works with individuals or groups of children to give them the very best possible care, removing barriers to learning, raising aspirations, and supporting every child in achieving their potential to appreciate human creativity and achievement.

Handle With Care

We encourage an open and full dialogue with parents to support our children. Information given is always handled sensitively, however, we understand that sometimes, when families are experiencing difficulties parents are unable to share details. If children come into school after a difficult or challenging night, morning or weekend, parents can email school with 'Handle with Care' and we will know that your child may need a little time, care or help that day.

Wellbeing Check

Every morning, class-based staff conduct a wellbeing check during registration. Children are asked to evaluate how they are feeling on a scale of 1-5. Class teachers take responsibility for the wellbeing of all our children and are passionate about ensuring there are strategies in place to support children who may not be feeling their best. Any child that rates themselves a 4 or 5 will be passed onto the Pastoral Manager, who will aim to resolve any concerns about their wellbeing.



Mental Health & Wellbeing Hub

At Chantlers, we commit to developing our school environment in order to enable us to deliver the best provision for all our children. This included investing in our Mental Health and Wellbeing Hub which is located in the meadow area of the school grounds. This hub is used for an array of sessions, including yoga and mindfulness.

Our School Environment

In addition to the Mental Health & Wellbeing Hub, we have ensured that our school environment and facilities directly support the development of the children's needs. Facilities around school include our fabulous pond area, first-class forest school facilities, an outdoor gym, adventure play equipment and friendship benches. Inside the school building, our environments are consistent from classroom to classroom and are purposely designed to promote a calm and purposeful environment. The introduction of lockers has supported pupil's sense of belonging and responsibility.

Wellbeing For Staff

We approach wellbeing holistically at Chantlers, this includes being responsible and committed towards the wellbeing of our staff. Our staff play a crucial role in the development of all of our children and our wellbeing commitment to them ensures that the children get the very best care and education. We provide the very best in pastoral and wellbeing support for all members of our Chantlers Family.

Forest School

Our Forest School area is an integral part of our school. It is based on our fundamental respect for children and young people and their capacity to investigate and be able to explore and have access to the outside world, through education and encouragement of their own curiosity.

Our School values envelop all that we strive to achieve within our whole school community and also the wider community. The Forest school area, allows each child to be able to interact with nature, to be able to work together, build relationships with each other, respect and understand our flora and fauna that surrounds our school, whilst learning and gaining experience of the outdoors.



Our Provision

At Chantlers, we aim to offer each year group a weekly Forest School session on a half termly basis. The schedule is rotated each year, so each Year Group gets to experience each season in the forest area. In addition, each class teacher is encouraged to use our outside facilities for cross curricular learning throughout the school year.

Forest School Ethos

The ethos of Forest School is based on a fundamental respect for children and young people and for their capacity to instigate, test and maintain curiosity in the world around them. It believes in a child’s right to play; the right to access the outdoors (and in particular a woodland environment); the right to access risk and the vibrant reality of the natural world; and the right to experience a healthy range of emotions, through all the challenges of social interaction, to build a resilience that will enable continued and creative engagement with their peers and their potential. It is an approach to education that makes use of the outdoor environment to create a unique learning tool.

Forest School sessions provide increasingly diverse opportunities for children to benefit from a supportive curriculum that can help children build positive values and attitudes about themselves, about learning, and the environment in which they live. Children are given appropriately challenging and achievable tasks that build their confidence, skills and independence and are given the time to thoroughly explore their thoughts, feelings and relationships. This time and reflective practice develops inter and intra-personal skills, which are well documented as being directly linked to learning skills.

Chantlers Chilling Club

Chantlers' Chilling Club offers families before and after school childcare and is based within our main building. The club operates each school day, with morning sessions running from 7:45am - 8:45am and afternoon sessions from 3:20pm till 5:30pm.

Children are offered a light breakfast of toast and sugar-free drinks in the morning sessions, with light snacks offered after school.

Chilling Club offers children a wide range of activities that stimulate and engage children in order to develop their communication and creativity.



Breakfast: £6 per hour
After School Club: £5.50 per hour

Parents can request a place once your school place has been confirmed. Parents can pay for Chilling Club through ParentPay. Nation childcare vouchers are also accepted.
