

YEAR GROUP: Reception

TIME ALLOCATION: 6 Weeks

Literacy

We will be reading "The Smartest Giant in Town", and talking about how he is proud of his achievements. We will be working hard this term to be proud of the work we produce. We will then move on to exploring the roles of people who help us in our community, such as doctors, police officers, and bus drivers. We will explore these roles further by reading non-fiction books about them.

Maths

In maths we will be exploring the composition of numbers 6,7,8,9 and 10. We will be working hard to look at how we can make each number and learn what each numeral looks like. We will also be exploring measurement and capacity in our outdoor area using a range of materials.

Understanding the World

At the start of this term, we will be learning all about Lunar New Year, and will explore how this special festival is celebrated.

Over this half term we will be discussing different people who help us. We will get the opportunity to meet some of these special people and talk about the important jobs they do.

SMSC

We will be particularly focusing on manners and thinking about other people's needs over the course of this topic.

BRITISH VALUES

We will be talking about why we have rules, how we can decide things together and why it's okay to have different ideas.

We will be using team games to enhance our communication and listening skills as we play with our friends.

Physical Development

We will continue be using our funky fingers across a range of areas in the classroom, we are especially focusing on our scissor skills. We will also be developing our gross motor skills in our outdoor area.

Expressive Arts and Design

In EAD, we will be using our junk modelling area to build our own boats using a range of materials.

We will be learning a poem to help with washing our hands.
