YEAR GROUP: Reception

TIME ALLOCATION: 6 Weeks

Literacy

This half term, we will be sharing a variety of stories and will introduce key vocabulary to the children linked to the texts. We will be encouraging the children to think of their own sentences, and to use their phonic knowledge when writing words. The children will also be encouraged to use a capital letter at the start of a sentence, and a full-stop at the end. In phonics, Reception will continue to review the phonemes they have learnt so far, before we move on to learning some tricky spelling rules.

Maths

In maths we will be learning more about 3D shapes, including spotting 2D shapes on their faces. We will also continue our number work by looking at numbers beyond 20 and by introducing the children to the concepts of addition and subtraction.

Understanding the World

During this half term, we will be sharing the story 'We're Going on a Lion Hunt' which is set in Africa. We will then use this story to look at what animals we might find in Africa and compare them to animals we find in other countries, We will then be sharing the story Handa's Surprise and will look at places that are special to us.

SMSC

We will be particularly focusing on manners and thinking about other people's needs over the course of this topic.


BRITISH VALVES

OUTCOME:

The children will be able to name animals that we might find in Africa and will be able to discuss the differences to animals we find here.

ASSESSMENT

In the Early Years, we assess children continuously by observing what they do, talking to them about their thinking and looking at the work that they produce.

Communication and Language

This half-term, we will be sharing various stories including Nelson's Dangerous Dive, Handa's Surprise and We're Going on a Bear Hunt. We will then be exploring like the family from We're Going on a Bear Hunt, looking at different materials and textures, and thinking of words we can use to describe them. We will also be encouraging the children to express their ideas and feelings about their own experiences, using full sentences and past, present and future tenses.

Physical Development This term, we will be continuing to develop our gross motor skills during our weekly PE sessions. We will also be continuing to develop our balance, strength and coordination during our trips to Forest School. This half term, we will also be encouraging the children to begin to use accuracy and care when they are drawing.

Expressive Arts and Design We will be exploring African Art, experimenting with zig-zag During imaginative play, we will be encouraging the children narratives during their play.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

This half-term we will be continuing our Jigsaw work with the new theme 'Relationships'. We will be discussing ways in which we can make friends and what we can do to be a good friend. We will be encouraging the children to show sensitivity to their own needs, and those of their peers.
