Maths
In maths this half term, our topic is place value. We will be working with numbers up to 10 and making sure that we know how to write these numbers correctly. We will be counting, ordering and comparing these numbers and placing them on a number line. We will also be looking at 1 more and 1 less.

Our Design and technology topic is structures. In this topic we will be constructing a windmill.
