English
In English, we will be looking at non-fiction texts. We will look at a range of non-fiction examples e.g. posters, leaflets and information books to find out their features. Then we will start to create our own information pieces using a title, sub-headings, a contents page, an index page and a glossary.

Maths
In maths this half term, we will continue to look at place value within 50. We will become secure in our understanding of tens and ones and we will then start to apply this knowledge to addition and subtraction. We will use a range of materials to help us with our understanding and application.

Science
In Science this half term, we will continue to look at seasonal change whilst also learning all about plants. We will look at the different parts of a plant and the job each part does. We will learn about the differences between deciduous and evergreen trees and we will even have a go at growing our own plants.

The children will gain an understanding of what a monarch is and what a coronation ceremony looks like. We will compare monarchs from the past and monarchs today and we will sequence some key monarchs on a timeline.
