English
This half term is our Shakespeare Festival. We will begin by looking at who William Shakespeare was, then we will read his play, 'As you like it'. We will then complete a setting description of the Forest of Arden. Finally, we will be writing our own poetry based on the play.

Maths
In maths this half term, our first topic is length and height. We will then look at mass, capacity and temperature. We will also be continuing our maths fluency work.

Science
In Science this half term, our topic is 'Everyday Materials'. We will learn to identify a range of different materials, their properties and their uses. We will then look at living things and their habitats.

Computing
In computing this half term, the children will develop their understanding of what information technology (IT) is. They will identify devices that are computers and consider how IT can help them, both at school and beyond.

Religious Education

History

Art and Design

We will be continuing our topic on 'Cooking and Nutrition'. We will be learning about healthy eating and balanced diets. We will also be making our own healthy wrap.
