YEAR GROUP: 1

TIME ALLOCATION: 7 weeks

English

In English, we will be looking at letter writing. Following a sequenced approach, we will be reading the book 'Kipper's Toy Box', we will use this to support our writing. We will then be reading the book 'Beegu', and using this to write diary entries.

Maths

In maths this half term, our topics are addition and subtraction. Through small steps, we will be able to solve a range of different addition and subtraction calculations.

Science

In music this half term, we will be focussing on singing and performing Christmas songs.


Physical Education

This half term, we will be focussing on ball skills. We will be learning and practising a range of skills that can be applied to a variety of games.


