What do we know about World War One?



English
In English, we will be looking at instructions. Following a sequenced approach, we will be reading a range of instructional pieces, from this we will gain an understanding of the features of instructions. We will then plan and write our own instructions. Together we will edit our writing.

Maths
In maths this half term, our topic is place value. We will be working with numbers up to 100. Our work will look at understanding 2-digit numbers. We will be comparing and ordering numbers. This will help us to understand where numbers fit on a variety of number lines.

Science
In Science this half term, our topic is Everyday Materials. We will learn to identify a range of different materials, their properties and their uses.

Computing
In computing this half term, the children will develop their understanding of what information technology (IT) is. They will identify devices that are computers and consider how IT can help them both at school and beyond.

Religious Education
Our topic in RE this half term is, 'Who is a Muslim and how do they live?'

Geography
We will not be covering geography objectives this half term.

History
In our historical study this half term, we will be looking at World War One. We will learn about this crucial event in our history.

Art and Design
In Art and Design, our main focus is drawing. We will be telling a story with our art work.

Design Technology
Our Design and technology topic is mechanisms. In this topic we will be constructing a fair ground wheel.

Music
Our music topic this half term is animals. We will be focussing on a West African call and response song.

Physical Education
This half term, we will be focussing on fundamental movement skills in a range of different sports.

Children will first look at what they already know about World War One. They will then look at an important person from World War One and then look at what life was like during this time.
