English
In English, the children will develop their writing skills through the study and creation of non-chronological reports. Drawing on their prior learning from Geography, particularly their topic on rainforest environments, the children will use their knowledge of rainforest animals to research, organise, and present information clearly. They will learn how to structure a report effectively, using features such as headings, subheadings, factual language, and paragraphs.

Maths
In Maths this half term, the children will begin by learning about money, including recognising the value of coins and notes, calculating totals, and finding change from larger amounts. They will then move on to time, where they will read analogue and digital clocks and solve simple time problems, including calculating durations and understanding everyday time contexts.

Science
In science this half term, we will be focusing on plants. We will be looking at the function of plants and then looking at how flowers play in the life cycle of flowering plants, including pollination, seed formation and seed dispersal.
